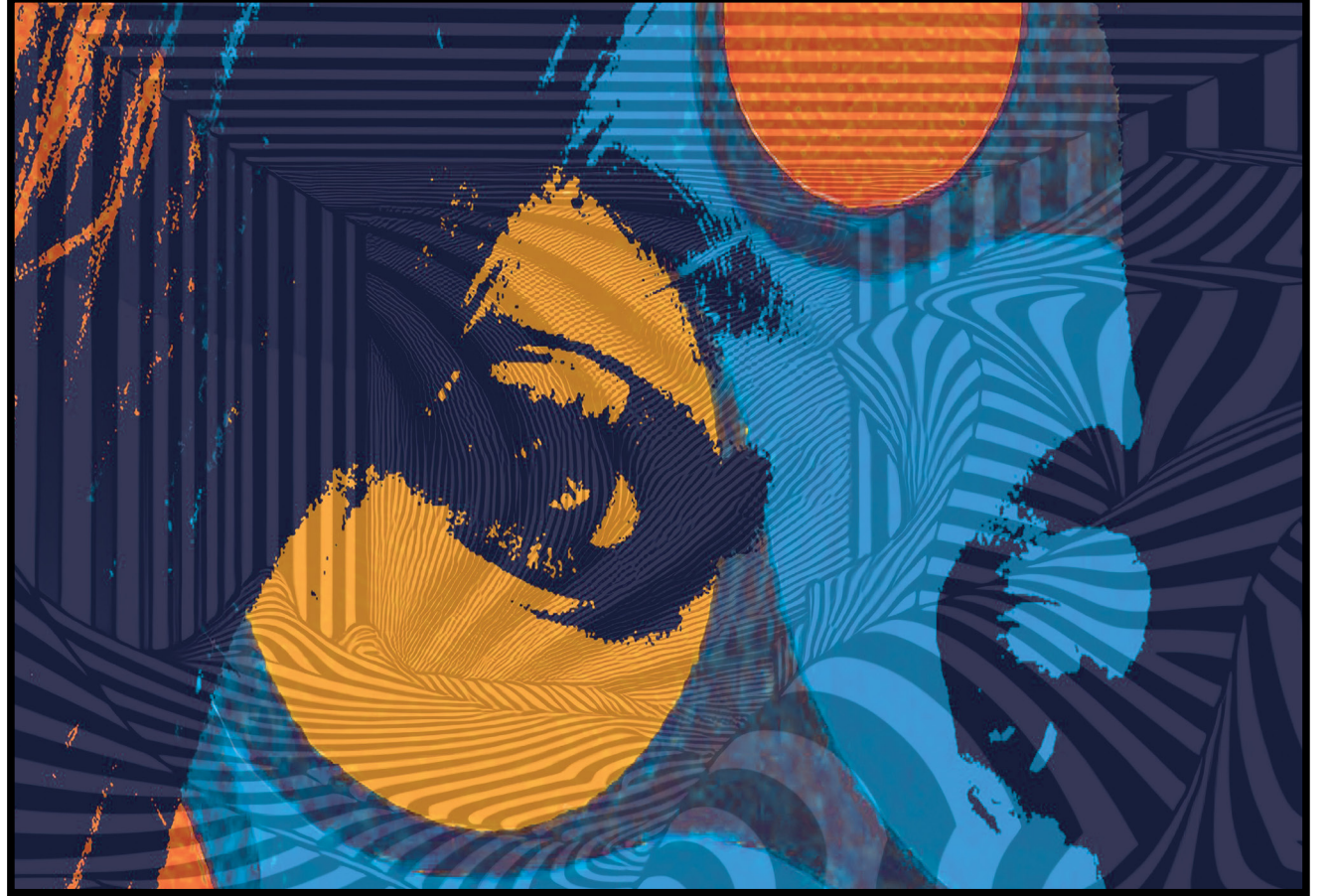

This work is a symbol that unites the ancient past of Anatolia, the sacred power of nature and the deep meanings of hearth culture. Each piece that carries the spirit of the land symbolizes the first traces of settled societies and their deep connection with animal husbandry. The bull figure symbolizes strength, fertility and protection, while the simplicity of the form and the balance within it reflect the aesthetic understanding of the past. The hearth is the source of life in Anatolian culture, a center that unites, protects and nourishes the family; this work likewise reminds us of the sacred function of the hearth. Each piece is a powerful reminder of the eternal relationship between man and nature and that everything exists by nourishing each other.

Within the scope of modernist understanding, the dynamism brought by the Industrial Revolution, the functionality of Bauhaus, the concept of speed in Futurism, and the technical lines of Suprematism have all contributed elements that reinforce humanity's belief in space and a higher future. Therefore, the aesthetics of the 20th century viewed art not merely as a pursuit of beauty, but also as a tool for the cognitive and technological evolution of humanity. Today, this progressive spirit has given way to postmodernity, where concepts are blurred and no longer fixed. Suprematist Reflections expresses a longing for the revival of this progressive spirit by intertwining retro lines with the Suprematist reflections of the past and cosmic dreams directed toward space.

This work questions the fragile boundary between self and consciousness. Reflection is not just a physical image; it is an internal confrontation. The symmetrical placement of the figures reflects the individual's alienation from themselves and their desire for transformation. While traditional marbling texture symbolizes the fluidity of emotions, serigraphy and acrylic accents reveal the fragmented structure of identity. Every line, every stain whispers the unseen behind the visible. This is not a mirror; it is a passage that goes back and forth between time, memory and identity. Reflection is not something to be looked at, it is something to be felt.

In Latin, persona means “mask,” the kind worn by actors on stage. In Jung’s terms, it is the public façade shaped by the ego to conceal its true essence from society. Put more simply, the persona is the mask we wear to relate to others. We adopt the personality expected of us—sometimes knowingly, sometimes unconsciously—to protect ourselves or to gain acceptance. Jung names this adopted role the persona.

As we play the roles imposed on us, how many masks do we wear? How many heroes do we become in the pursuit of approval?

Is the hero the one hidden behind the mask—the figure who holds the shadows and the parts we try to suppress?

Or is the hero the one who dares to stand apart from the mask, closer to the truth?

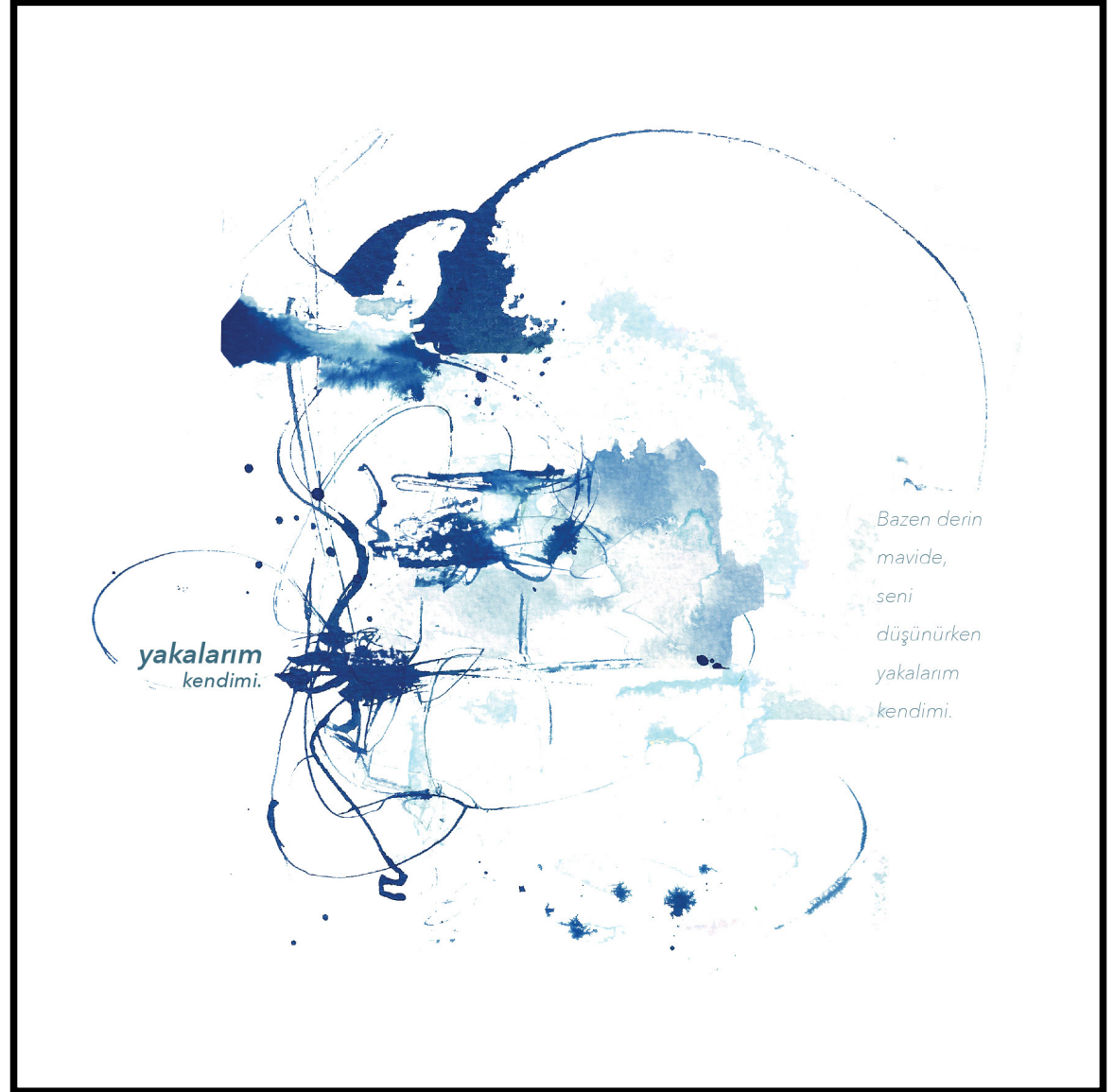
Berna KARAÇALI - *Persona*

In this context, the work “Köprü Üzerinde 1” questions the role of bridges and crossings, which we cross in our daily lives without realizing it, on our urban experiences and focuses on the threshold psychology it creates on individuals.

In this work, the dynamic distribution of yellow, black and white colours evokes the body structure and collective movements of honey bees, referring to the harmonious organisation of their colonies. The repetitive and overlapping forms in the composition create an abstract narrative depicting the honeycomb-making process and the collective functioning of bees in their pollination activities. The textural differences and colour transitions in the image emphasise the contribution of bees to biodiversity and the layered nature of the processes involved in honey production. In this context, the work provides both a visual and conceptual depth on bee ecology, making the viewer feel their critical importance for nature.

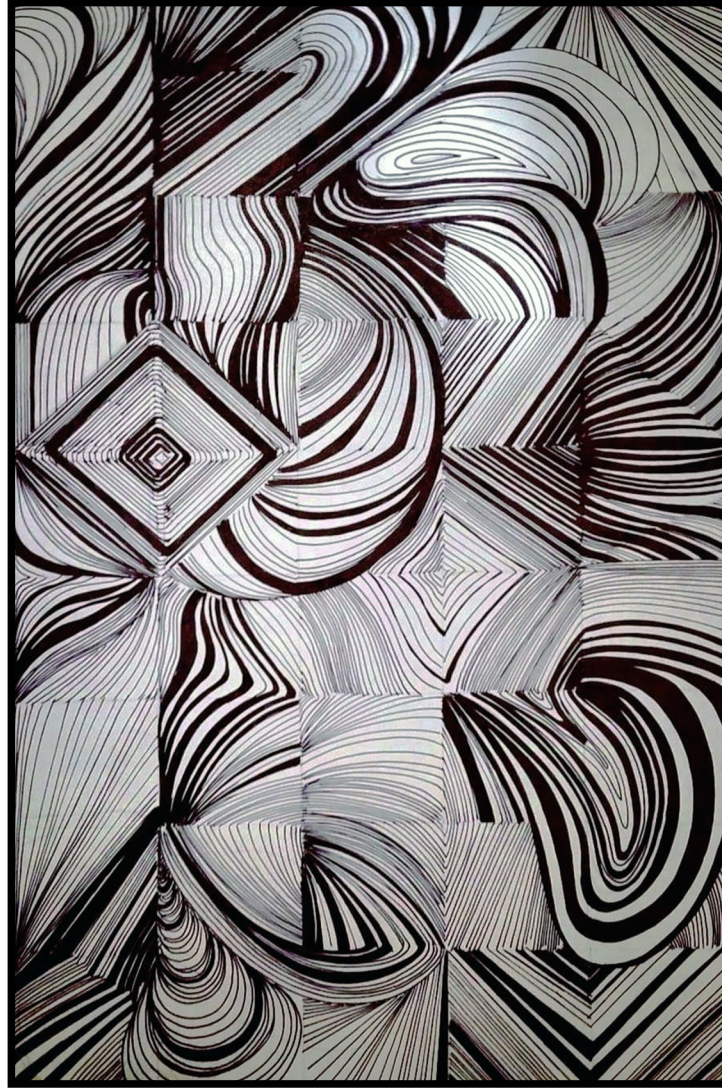

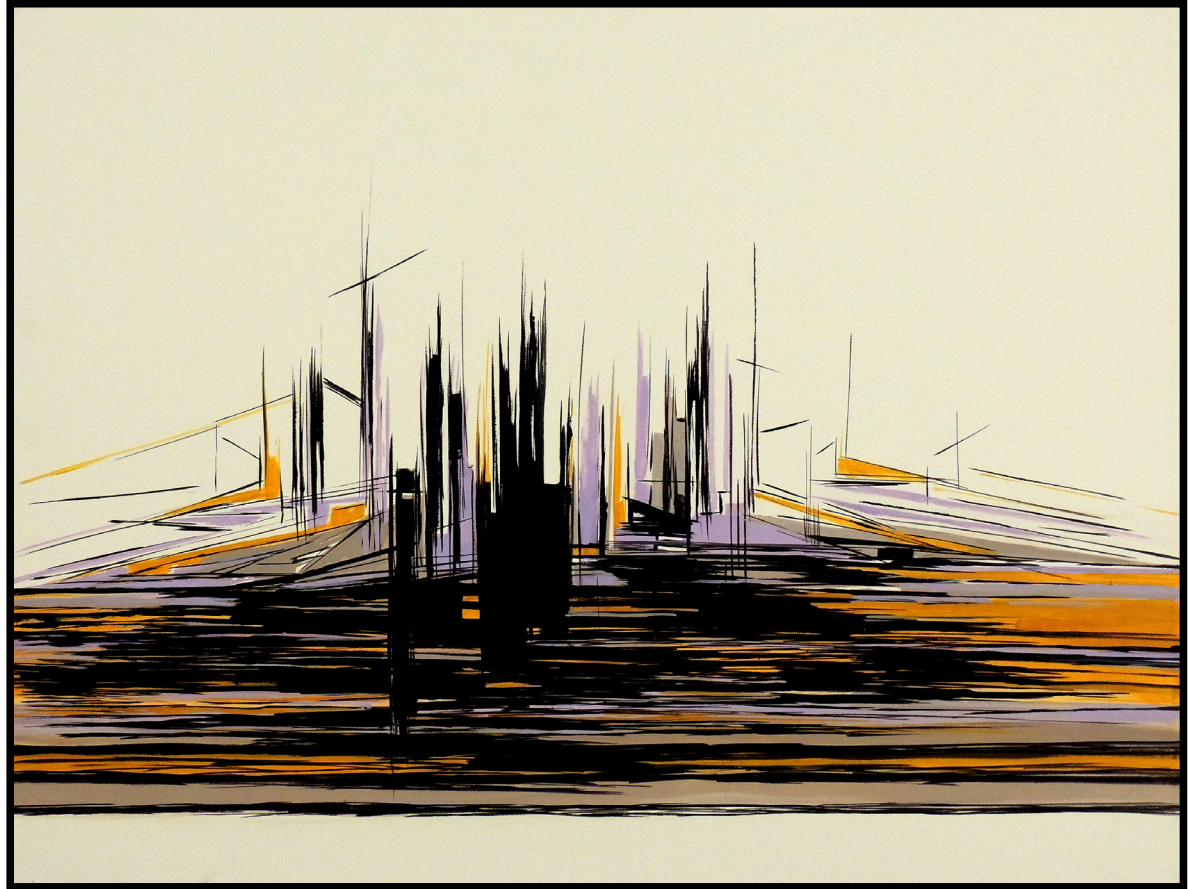
Eda UYGAN BOZOĞLU - *Çizgilerin Yansıması*



Art is a mirror that questions the realities of humanity. “Face to Face” addresses the process of an individual confronting themselves and the inner turmoil behind the masks imposed by society. This work visualizes the tension between an individual’s social identity and their true self, while inviting the viewer to confront themselves. The color palette used in the work represents the nature of confrontation that requires both courage and fragility. While the smiling expression of the mask symbolizes the false messages given to the outside world, the face behind the mask is a silent echo of real emotions. This illustration emphasizes the difficulties of being an individual in modern society, identity confusion, and the deep-rooted effect of superficial relationships.

Space experiences are fragments of a whole, composed like pieces of the potential to occur in one another. In the process extending from the surface to the space, the constructed topographical structures become changing and transforming entities that extend from the surface to the world of experience. The necessary possibilities of space enable the transformation of work each time, allowing us to experience it from a different perspective. The representation of ambiguous areas related to space expresses the totality of relationships that reshape themselves according to time and space. The effort to capture the experiential responses of architectural spaces by the body might be the most general expression of the process.

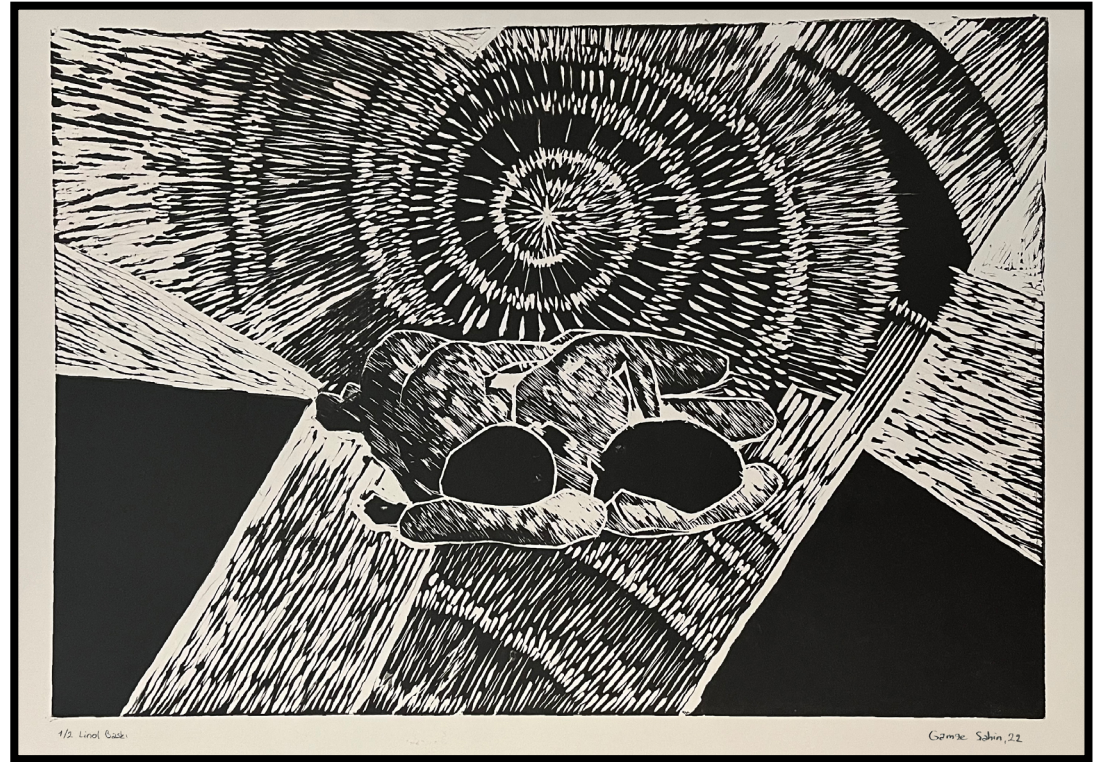

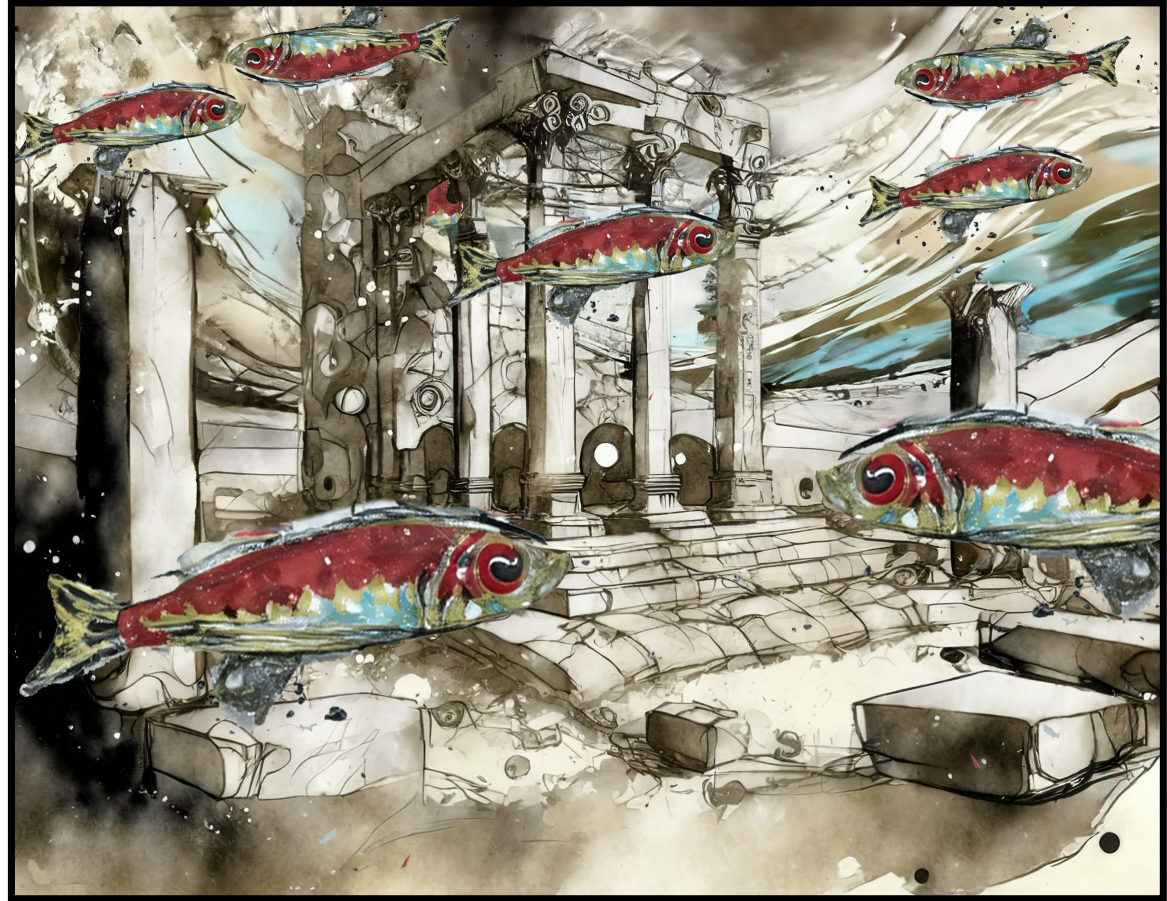

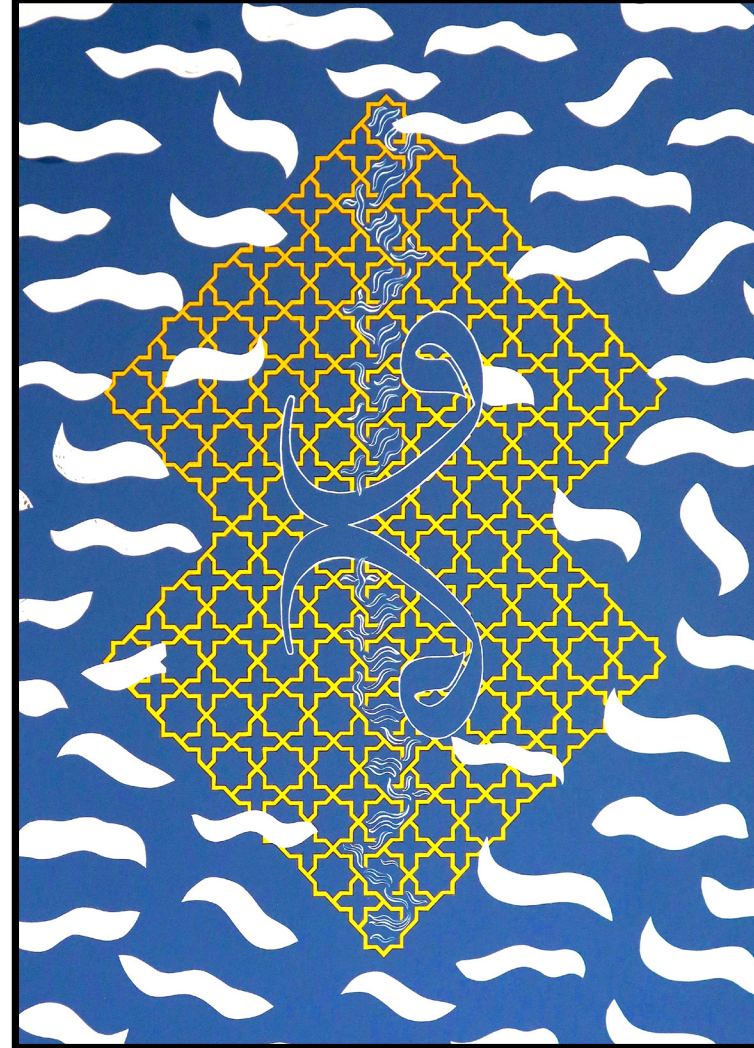
